## THE PORT FISHING REPORT:

### FEBRUARY 16TH SALMON OPENING

#### **Marine Area 9**

Salmon fishing re-opens February 16th in marine areas 8-1, 8-2, and 9. The daily salmon limit will be one salmon. Release coho and wild chinook.

#### **Marine Area 10**

Anglers can now keep two hatchery chinook salmon. Anglers were previously limited to one hatchery chinook as part of a two-salmon daily limit to ensure the fishery would remain open for the entire season.
